New Boston Firm to Commercialize Georgetown University's MyCareTeam™ Diabetes Care Management Software

The MyCareTeam web-based application makes it possible for diabetics to easily transmit their blood sugar readings directly from standard, commercially available glucose meters to a secure database that is accessible over the Internet via standard web browsers. Once the data is stored, patients, doctors and other care providers can collaborate to monitor glucose levels and realize the effect that exercise and diet have on the diabetic patient's overall health.

"Our own studies, combined with those conducted at the Boston Veteran's Administration by a leading endocrinologist from Brigham and Women's hospital in Boston have shown us that there is a direct link between intensive management with the MyCareTeam application and improved diabetic outcomes," said Martin Mullins, Vice President of the Office of Technology Licensing at Georgetown University Medical Center.
